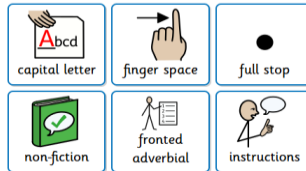


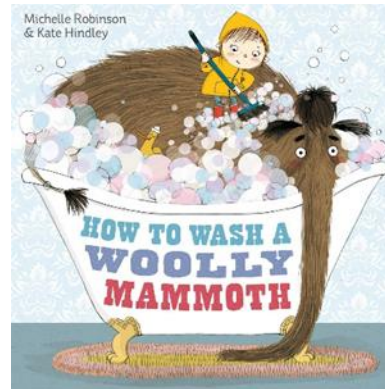
English

- I can use the spellings I have learnt in my writing.



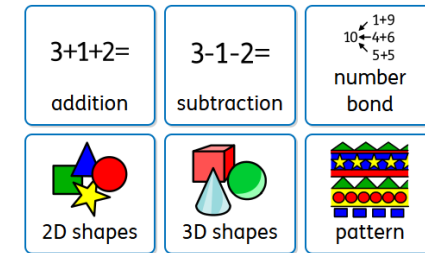
Year 1, Term 2 Connected Curriculum Map

English book: How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth



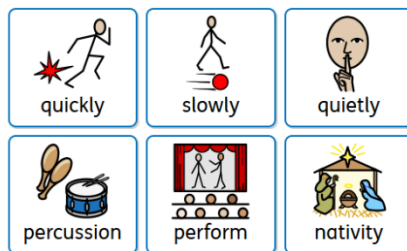
Maths

- I can make patterns with 2D and 3D shapes.



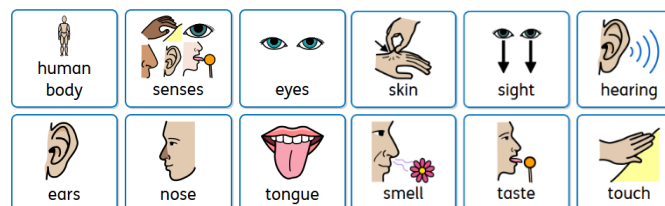
Music

- I can participate in the year group Nativity.



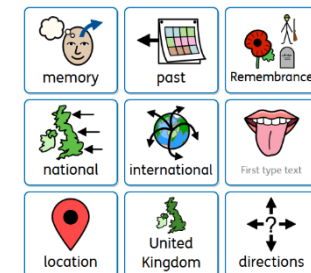
Science

- I can make a simple map and plan.



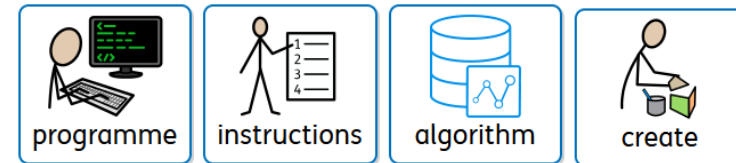

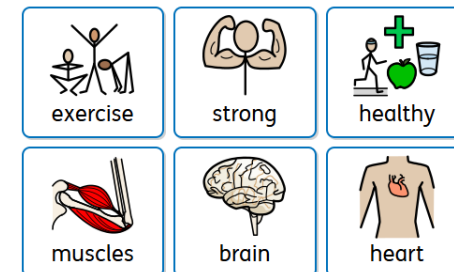

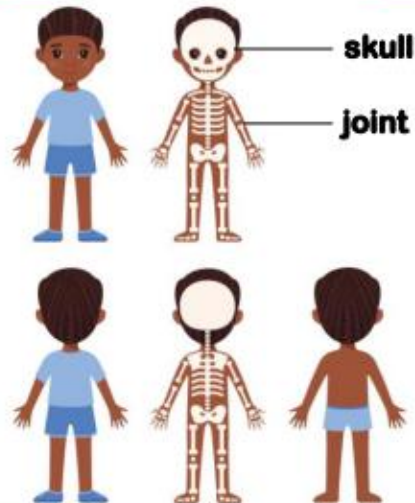
