

Year 1, Term 5

How does the sky change?




English

- I can write about what has happened using verbs in the past tense. (went, ate, arrived etc.)
- I can add my own opinion within my writing. (I thought the ... looked ... because...)
- I can write using first person pronouns. (I, me, we, us)
- I can use my phonics to help me spell words phonetically.
- I can use a capital letter, finger spaces and full stops when writing a sentence.
- I can learn a model text.
- I can retell a familiar story.

Maths

- I can describe turns and positions. (half turn, full turn, quarter turn, left, right, forwards, backwards, above and below)
- I can use ordinal numbers.
- I can count from 50-100 and partition numbers into tens and ones.
- I can find one more and one less to 100.
- I can compare numbers up to 100.
- I can recognise coins and notes.
- I can count in coins.
- I know the days of the week and months of the year.
- I know the difference between hours, minutes and seconds.
- I can tell the time to the hour and half hour.



Science

- I can name the four seasons.
- I can understand the different weather that happens in autumn, winter, spring and summer.
- I can make comparisons about the amount of rainfall over 5 weeks.



Art

- I can express my opinion about a piece of art, saying what I like and dislike.
- I can manipulate malleable materials in a variety of ways including rolling, pinching and kneading.
- I can shape and model materials for a purpose.
- I can experiment with constructing and joining recycled, natural, and manmade materials with a purpose in mind.
- I can apply simple decoration techniques; impressed, painted, and applied.
- I can use tools and equipment safely and in the correct way.

English/Science

This term we will be looking at money and recognising the value of different coins and notes. When you are going to the shops, can you select some of the correct coins that you need to pay with? Your grown up might say "Can I have a 50p and a 10p coin?" or "Please can I have a £10 note?" → see if you can find the right ones!




Art

Create your own fitness circuit! Draw it out, film it, ask your family to complete it at home. You could time how long it takes to complete or set a timer for each station in the circuit. E.g. squats, star jumps, press ups! We are trying to think about improving our fitness in term 5!
